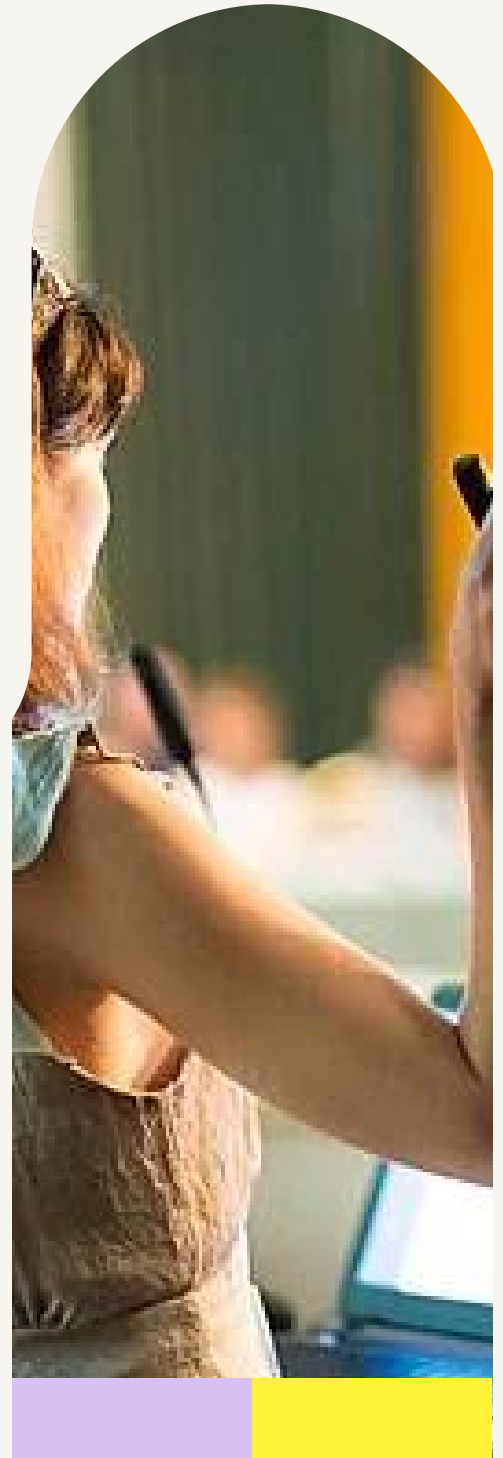


Introduction

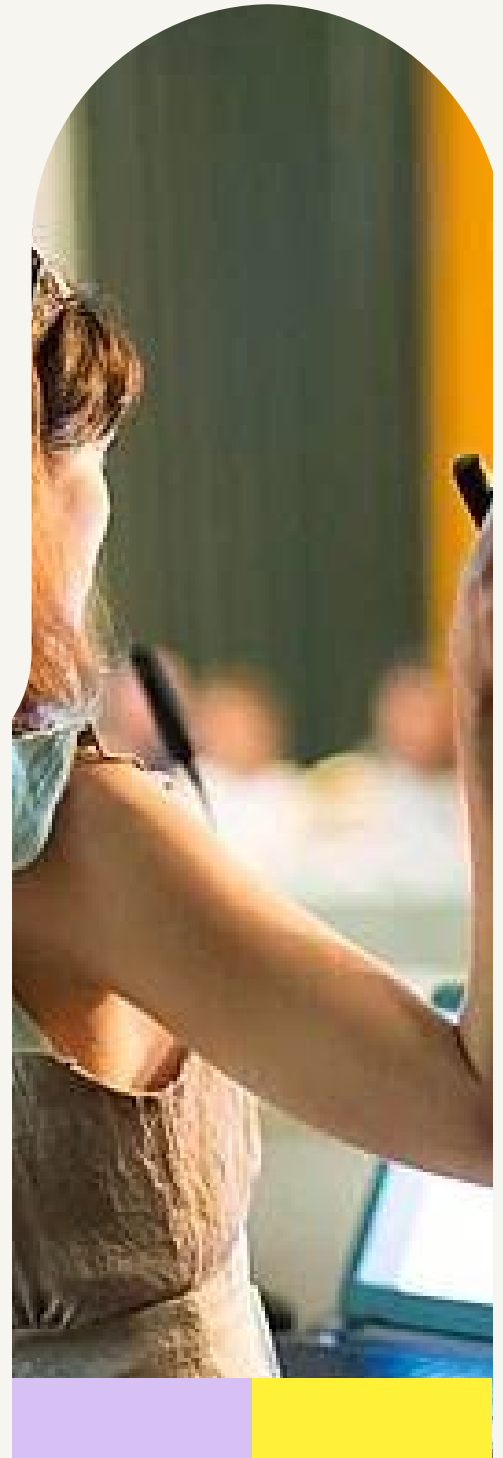
